Presence of listeners filling the concert hall of Philharmonic confirms, that every year competition auditions attract the interest of people.

The choirs competed in 2 categories: amateur and professional presenting interesting repertoire.

Special achievement of the Festival is promoting not only well known compositions from huge heritage of Orthodox Church music, but also presentation of newly discovered songs in this field.

Special events commemorating the 90th anniversary of late Krzysztof Penderecki's birth took place during the Festival: the exhibition "Maestro Penderecki and the Festival" and the Inaugural Concert performed by the National Philharmonic Choir, conducted by Bartosz Michałowski. In addition, the audience listened to an exciting concert of Orthodox Church music of Belarus "Mahutny Bozha"/"Almighty God" - The Singing Soul of Belarus. The culmination of the Festival is the Gala Concert with the participation of the winners of the Festival.

Jury would like to thank the organizers for huge effort put in the realization of this year's edition of the Festival, especially to its director – Mr. Mikołaj Buszko, Ms. Irena Parfieniuk - manager of the Festival office and coworkers.
